## **Livonia District Competition**

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Place Finish at Livonia

Oh, you thought Gull Lake's 3rd place finish was their peak? Think again. Team 3641, The Flying Toasters made more than just an appearance at Livonia Churchill High School on March 27-28.

Having already qualified for states, the restless team used Livonia as an opportunity of practice and scouting for up-coming challenges they are going to face. The Toasters were able to maintain a top 5 rank through most of the tournament. When all 80 rounds came to an end and alliance selection began, the Toasters were the 3rd seed team with an average qualification score of 102.58.

With all of the excitement built up, the main representatives of the team had to discuss tactics and allies they were going to need for the next few intense rounds. After embracing the work of their wonderful scouts, Team 3641 chose Team 503 Frog Force from Novi, and Team 5756 DHDC Robotics from Detroit to be their allies for the fierce playoffs to come.

These three strong allies put up an extreme fight against all their competitors. They were able to conquer through the quarter finals, the semifinals, and all the way up to the championship round, against the legendary Team 67 Hot Team from Highland with their outstanding allies Team 548 Robostangs from Northville, and Team 4405 Atoms Family from Canton. With a strong fight to the end, The Flying Toasters and their alliance unfortunately lost to their challenging opponent. Ben Wolak, stated, "The robot and drive team performed very well, making it all the way to the finals, and giving the champions a run for their monev."

**Bedford District Competition** 

Competing at the Bedford District Competition on April 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4th, the Toasters faced a hurdle when one of the drivers was sick. Senior Bryce B came to the rescue and operated the robot's arm. Together with Ethan N and Kyle J, they competed valiantly. After qualifications, the team was ranked 4th out of 40 teams.

During alliance selections, the second seed Team 1189 The Gearheads from Grosse Pointe chose the Toasters and Team 5252 Cyber Tigers from Detroit to form an alliance. The alliance advanced through the quarterfinals, semifinals, and reached the finals.

In the epic finale, they faced the legendary home town favorites of Team 1023 Bedford Express from Bedford/Temperance, Team 548 Robostangs from Northville, and Team 4395 Vi-Borgs from Dundee. Game one was so close. Only 1 point separated the contenders. However, in the end, we were a little toasted and came in 2<sup>nd</sup>.




