• FIRST stands for "For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology" and was founded in 1989 by Dean Kamen to inspire young people's interest and participation in science and technology. FIRST designs accessible, innovative programs that motivate young people to pursue education and career opportunities in science, technology, engineering, and math, while building self-confidence, knowledge, and life skills.

Commitment

 We have found that in order to be a full contributing member of the robotics team, a member needs to commit to a minimum level of attendance. Apart from the required Monday Team meeting attendance, there is no specific attendance requirement for participating in team meetings and helping on the team, students who do not meet a minimum time commitment will find it difficult to be involved on more than the most basic level. This is a team just like a sports team and commitment and practice is necessary for success.

Competition season participation

- The competition season runs from January through April and we can meet up to six days a week with a whole meeting on Monday and Friday. During this season a minimum of two meetings a week to be a full participating member of the team. We also meet and work on the robots during school breaks - especially during the winter break before the stop build date. Returning members often schedule family trips around these dates because a lot of fun and exciting work is done during that time.
- The team does a lot of work and designing on the weekends when there is more time and there are more mentor resources available. Because of the short design and build timeline, time critical projects will be worked on each week. A project started on a Wednesday evening during the competition season may have completely changed or be finished by the next Wednesday evening. Members, who want to see their projects through to completion, need to show up to several meetings a week. Some students and mentors work late into the evenings and weekends as we get closer to our deadlines and the more students who are committed to help when they can, on the weekends will allow us to get more done on the robot and increase our odds of performing well. Students who spend a lot of time on robotics also find that their time spent is more fun and rewarding.

Attendance

 As stated, we have found that in order to be a full contributing member, commitment and practice is necessary for success.
 Moreover, we have found that students do not read nor act on emails, so...

Monday Meetings from 6-9pm are REQUIRED

- Team communication

- Attendance taken at 6:10pm & 9pm
- Critical Sub Teams will expect regular attendance as part of their selection process:
 - Drive Team, Pit, Strategy, Chairman's, etc.

Leadership

- Students who commit to being leaders on the team find it to be very rewarding. Team leadership often spends time outside team meetings working on their leadership tasks and this extra commitment should be understood and taken into account when stepping into leadership roles.
- Because a high level of commitment from team members is required to learn how to contribute and perform well as a team, students who do not meet the member in good standing expectations will not be excused from school to attend competitions.

Off Season participation

- The off season is the time during the school year after the competitions are over in April until before the first weekend in January including the summer. Spending more time learning in the off season will make members, both new and returning, more prepared for the season. Once the season starts in January, there is much less time for training.
- Typically, one cannot master a skill on just a training session alone. Time outside of robotics will be required for students to research, learn, and practice skills on their own.

Academics, School & Studies

- Education is better than money in the bank; they can never take it away from you. Therefore, Academics, School, & Studies are very important. As the robotics competition season can become very time demanding, students are encouraged to develop ways to find a "balance". Learning this life skill is very important for success in their future.
- Students (with exception of the Required Monday Meetings) are to take care of schooling.
- It is without a doubt a good idea for students to tap other students in robotics for assistance & tutoring; We are all practically geniuses, right?
