Issue #1 Build Season - January 2018

Kick-Off:

Kickoff was held on January 6th for all of the FIRST Robotics Competition teams. It was live streamed on Twitch for every team around the world to watch together. Kickoff is when FIRST releases the challenge for the season. This challenge details what the rules and objectives of the competition will look like, and gives teams the basic guidelines for what the robot has to do. Following kickoff, teams get six weeks to build the robotno more than that! It also has to fit certain weight and budget constraints in order to make the game fair all teams. The University of Michigan was kind enough to invite our team to the Saturday kickoff event and a Sunday planning and strategy session.





Power Up:

The name of the 2018 game is Power Up! The theme is based off of retro arcade games. The main objective is to be able to move the Power Cubes to the scale and switch in order to tip it into your possession. For more information, watch the official FIRST game video here:

Machining:

With only six weeks to plan, design, prototype, and finally machine and assemble a robot from scratch, machining is an important part of the Build Season. The Toasters have a machine shop at South Lyon East, the high school where the team holds meetings. This allows for the students (supervised and assisted by mentors), to machine all of the parts themselves during meeting times. This is an invaluable experience for team members to learn how to problem solve and work with their hands. Some of the individual parts they have to machine are the intake, chassis, lift, and climbing mechanisms.

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


